Your complete guide to creating an icicle bauble

8cm Fillable Baubles

Artificial Craft Trees

High Heat Hot Glue Gun <u>link</u>



3mm Macrame cord <u>link</u>



Sticky Tape <u>link</u>



180 Grit Sandpaper <u>link</u>

Process:

Step 1

Clip your two halves of the bauble together. Using your sandpaper, sand in X patterns all over the bauble to represent icicles. Wipe it with a cloth to remove any dust.





Step 2

Using your glue gun, glue two trees to the base of one bauble half, and glue 1 tree to the other bauble half. You can bend the trees slightly (as they're made from wire) so as they are straight.









Step 3Pour enough snow into 1 half, to cover the bases of the trees and clip the halves back together



Step 5

Cut a length of macrame rope (or ribbon of choice) and wrap a small amount of sticky tape around the end tightly (like a shoelace) and thread through the hole. Tie in a knot and you have a beautiful icicle Christmas bauble!









Troubleshooting:

• My cord doesn't fit in the hole

I find that 3mm cord fits through the hole, once taped tightly. Although, if you are using cord which is larger than 3mm, it may not fit. In this case, I suggest using a small ribbon and folding it in half and then threading through the hole
